**PURPOSE:** To provide important information and guidance both in <u>English and in Spanish</u> to parents of freshman students in order to help their child have a successful beginning at Norwalk High School.

**WHO:** Claudia Cuevas de Taranto will present/moderate/coordinate each seminar with input and collaboration with leaders & members of different programs & activities, department chairs, administrators & colleagues.
